#### Highlights of NUCA of Florida Achievements 2023-2024 By Kari Hebrank, Carlton Fields

NUCA of Florida's government affairs program has successfully advocated for our members in both the legislative and regulatory arena during the past few years. Our advocacy efforts are funded in part by members' dues, direct individual donations and through our Bidding for Benjamin's program.

#### Legislative Wins

During the 2024 Session, your NUCA of Florida's advocacy team collaborated with Governor DeSantis and state lawmakers to pass several pro-construction bills and defeat harmful legislation including:

- Passed HB 705 which prevents local governments from excluding certain contractors from the bidding process, imposing wage and employment conditions on contractors, or mandating specific hiring and training protocols.
- Passed HB 433 which preempts the regulation of heat illness & injury policies for workers to the State to keep local governments from enacting their own policies that may be duplicative or in conflict with OSHA requirements. HB 433 also prohibits local governments from giving preference in competitive solicitations based on an employer's heat exposure requirements. (NUCA of Florida worked to help defeat such a local ordinance offered by Miami-Dade County earlier this year.)
- Passed HB 433 which also preempts local wage and employee benefits ordinances beginning in 2026 when the minimum wage increases to \$15 an hour and prohibits local governments from using evaluation factors, qualification of bidders or otherwise awarding preferences based on wages or employee benefits.
- Defeated HB 825/SB 708 which would have changed the current 2-day timeline for marking underground facilities to a 3-day timeline before excavation could begin and changed the timeline for a positive response from the current 2 days to 3 days. The legislation also added a new violation for failure to notify of a planned excavation start date and time before beginning excavation if the member operator provides timely notice of the existence of a high-priority subsurface installation.
- Passed SB 770 which expands the Property Assessed Clean Energy Program (PACE) program to be used for converting from septic to sewer systems.
- > Passed HB 267 which streamlines the permitting process for construction projects.
- Passed HB 917 relating to Career & Technical Education (CTE) to get students interested in construction trades with hands-on training and develop a statewide CTE education asset map which includes courses offered, budgets, workforce alignment and dual-enrollment opportunities among other areas of CTE education.



#### Highlights of NUCA of Florida Achievements 2023-2024 By Kari Hebrank, Carlton Fields

Lobbied the Construction Industry Licensing Board to adopt rules to implement the Specialty Contractor legislation that ensures a road paving company does not need a state license.

#### Other Achievements for Our Members

In addition to our regulatory and legislative wins, NUCA of Florida provided additional member benefits, including:

- Increased revenues from our Annual ASJMSF Bass Tournament which allowed us to award \$55,250 in scholarships to 24 students, including one vocational scholarship, in 2023.
- Increased revenues and set a new a record for both number of scholarships awarded and amount awarded from the 2024 ASJMSF Bass Tournament and awarded \$66,500 in scholarships to 32 students.
- Distributed campaign contributions worth \$54,750 in 2023 and are on track to exceed that amount in 2024.
- Worked with Zinzow Law to provide a free webinar on Claims Preservation which educated our members on how to review a contract, top contract clauses and best practices for claims preservation.
- Provided industry-specific educational training to our members during the Construction Industry Forum in July 2023 and July 2024.
- Increased exhibitor participation in the Annual Conference to a record-high 24 participants in 2023.
- > Visited local NUCA Chapters and provided regulatory and legislative updates.
- Had local lawmakers visit the Rinker Pipe manufacturing site in Gretna, Florida and distributed campaign contributions during the event.
- Invited lawmakers to attend local NUCA Chapter events and to speak at NUCA FL Legislative Days events in Tallahassee.
- Held two successful President's Cup golf events in 2023 to help fund the Advocacy Fund.

# Lee Commissioners award \$229M in Disaster Recovery grants for public facility and infrastructure projects

Lee Board of County Commissioners voted Sept. 3 to award more than \$229 million in grants for about 20 public facility and infrastructure projects funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery allocation to Lee County. The projects will be undertaken by Lee County, each municipality, the school district, the Lee County Electric Cooperative and nonprofit entities associated with governmental sponsors, county officials said.

#### **KEEP SCAMMERS AND HACKERS AT BAY**

We're living in the data age. The things we do on our phones and computers, on our internet-enabled smart devices, and on websites leave a trail of our activities and our personal information. That personal information has value — not just to us, but to scammers and hackers who want to steal our identities. Here are five things you can do to keep scammers and hackers at bay.

1. Secure your accounts so they're hard to crack. Use a strong password. And enable two-factor

authentication (2FA) on sensitive accounts like your email or financial accounts. 2FA adds an extra

layer of security by requiring a second form of verification.

2. Keep your <u>security software, operating system and internet browsers and apps up to date to</u> defend

against the latest threats.

3. Your <u>wireless network</u> is the gateway to all the Wi-Fi enabled devices in your home. To protect your

connected devices, replace the default Wi-Fi network password and router admin password with a


strong password. And encrypt your network to prevent unauthorized access.

4. Set your computer and phone to lock when you're not using them. That'll prevent unauthorized access to your computer if you step away or to your phone if you lose it.

5. Create a <u>backup copy</u> of your information. That way you can recover it if your device gets infected,

hacked, stolen, or lost. Back up your data to the cloud or an external drive.

Report scammers and hackers at <u>ReportFraud.ftc.gov</u>. If someone stole your personal information, report it, and get recovery steps, at <u>IdentityTheft.gov</u>.
